In our time, when everyone values only his own, his time, emotions, achievements, deeds of charity, obviously now become the privilege of those who seek it in the name of Jesus. After all, in charity a person realizes the highest gift of his vocation - the gift of Love. The history of the Logos Center confirms the fact of a unique interfaith mission that the Lord has been giving for decades to those whom we serve in the Logos and who have become partners in our ministry. After all, many of American churches long supported the mission of the Logos and those who are within the walls of this building, those who have found refuge and have learned that the Lord is Alive. The support announces the implementation of the highest principles of charity - "Charity as Paradise, full of blessings. "And it is so important to preserve this interfaith election of the Logos and to show for other denominations that serve in spiritual isolation that the Lord Jesus Christ is one body for all Christians! And then the world will really get better, and the voice of those we can help together will reach Heaven.

The tragic events of February 24 in Ukraine changed not only the course of life and life of every Ukrainian, but also the course of world history. In a few days, from a prosperous and beautiful country, Ukraine has become a country of tears, grief and terrible pain. It was scary when rockets flew and bomb blasts were heard everywhere, sirens sounded around the clock, sounding the air alarm, and the occupying forces were 1.5 km from our Logos center, and now it seemed to break into Kotsyubynske. The Logos Center did not stop its ministry. There were 150 people from the beginning of March who needed our help and now we have 70. We continue to provide the Logos with everything we need, including a 24-hour hot water supply to ensure our livelihood. In the first weeks, with our partners from the United States, we organized assistance primarily in our village Kotsyubynske. Assisted in the construction of bomb shelters: provided beds and mattresses, chairs, as well as provided the necessary medical minimum, which could help wounded defenders: bandages, drip systems and more. The Lord has blessed our work with you! During one of the rocket attacks on our village, a "racist" rocket-propelled grenade hit the territory of our warehouse, a truck standing nearby burned down, and our windows just flew. These are the realities we live in. When the occupying forces were pushed back from Irpen, Gostomel, Bucha, we began to form powerful aid to the east of the country. Together with volunteers from Union of Baptists of Ukraine (see photos) in early and mid-April two minibuses shipped (maximum load) assistance (clothing, footwear, crutches, walkers, hygiene products, diapers, etc.) for needy from the Dnieper, Mykolaiv, Zaporizhia, Kramatorsk, Novomoskovsk and Kharkiv. Thanks to the professionalism of drivers and knowledge of the area, part of the aid fell into the occupied territories, bypassing Russian checkpoints.

In Zaporizhia, volunteers of the "Coast of Hope" teams were able to organize coordination centers for refugees from Mariupol, Kherson, Energodar. They sent clothes, crutches, wheelchairs, medical supplies. Thanks to volunteers from Poland, they had the opportunity to provide food and medicine. In early May, aid was sent to the Cherkasy Regional Children's Hospital, which has a large number of children from eastern Ukraine. Logos volunteers also delivered crutches, walkers, orthopedic walking sticks to the Dyer Hospital in the Vyshhorod district of Kyiv region (the hospital continued to operate for almost two months under occupation). We have requests for help from different cities and towns. For help from Kharkiv and Kharkiv region (request for more than forty wheelchairs for soldiers who lost limbs). As well as 1,500 refugees cared for by local church volunteers (clothing, food, hygiene items, crutches, walkers, anything we can help with). Also, cities and towns need medicines, diapers, medical supplies materials, children's clothing, hygiene products, etc. Gostomel Military Hospital, which is currently in condition reconstruction after partial destruction requires medical beds and medical supplies. Dnipro and Mykolayiv expect support and assistance.
